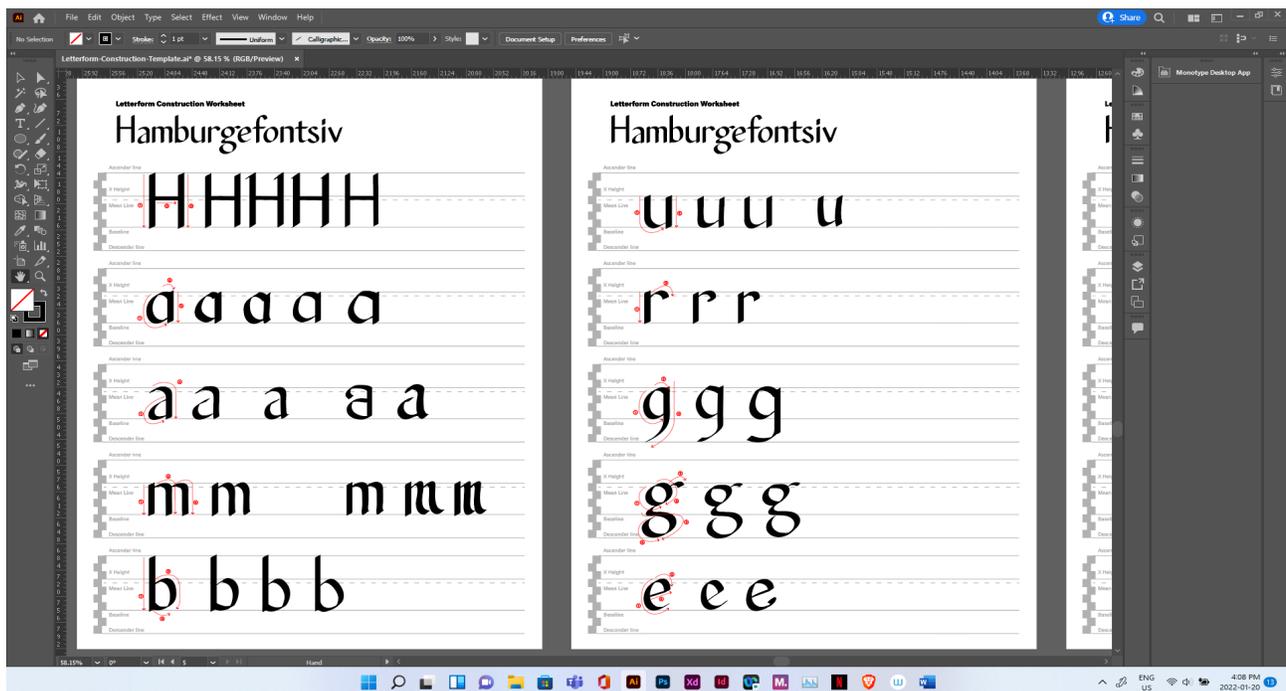

Typography Process

1st Stage Construction

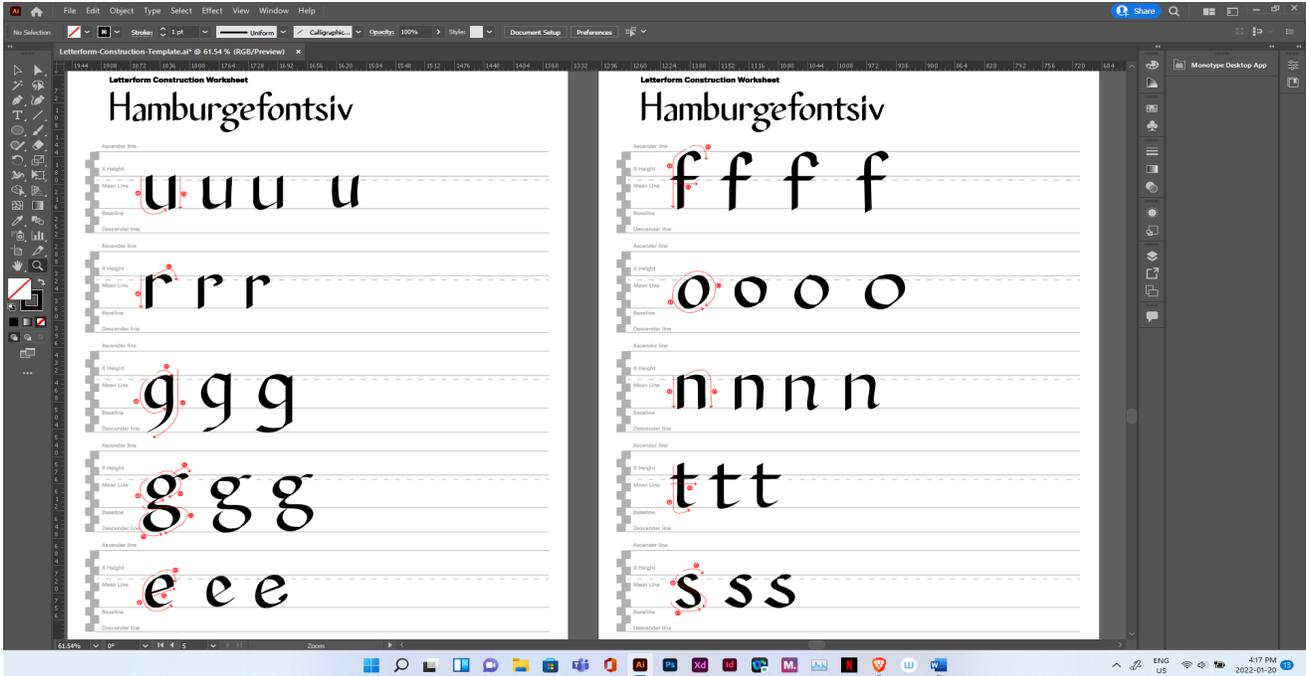
In the first Stage of the process, I start to sketch some of the letters.



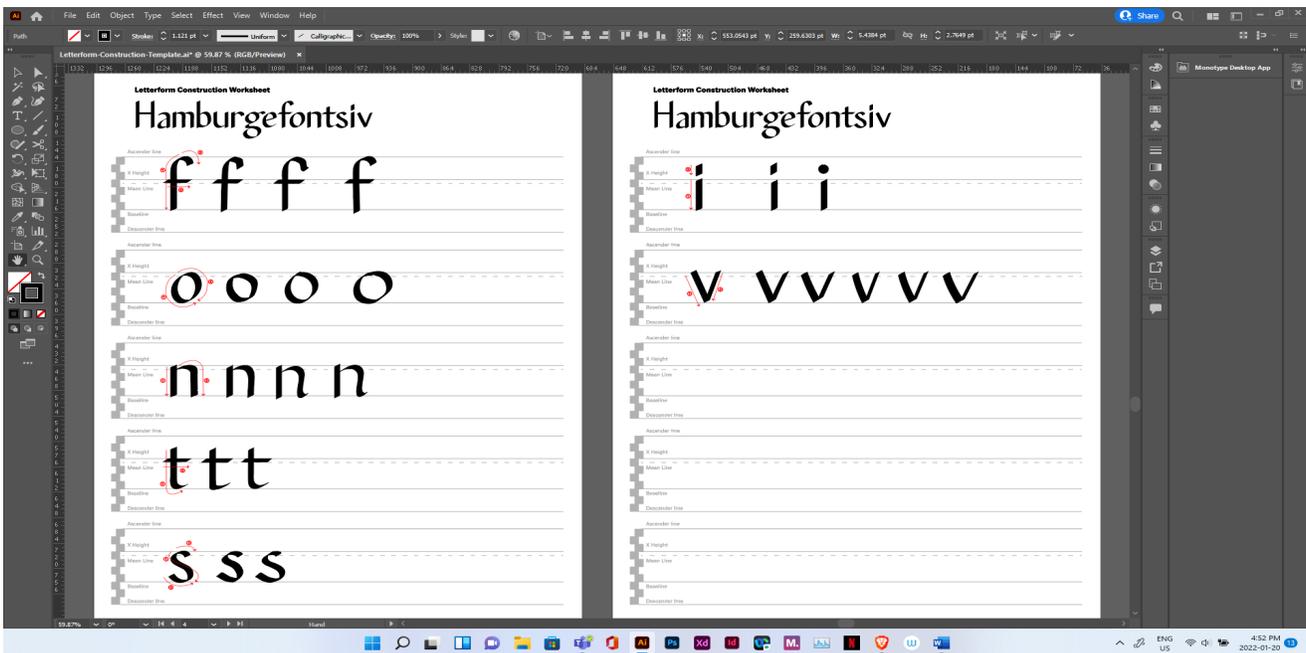
Trying to at the first stance follow the example of the teacher but, later I decide to try to give to my sketches a different style, with different modifications:

- I (Tried to) make the terminal in the 2- Story “a”, more rounded.
- The last “H” is my intent to do a Helvetica “H” with a thin Stem and Spine.
- The “r” shoulders are thin at the beginning and converging into a much thicker terminal.
- With the 2-story “g” I tried to simulate a similar shoulder – Terminal as the example. Although, I tried something different with the link and the loop, making a much more pronounced loop and closing the link at the end.

- I started the “M” as the example, but then I tried to slightly curve the end of the stem trying to end with a curved tail, but at the end I choosed to change the arcs instead.



- I stick with the example of the 1-story “g” but, I tried also to do it with more defined and wider lines.

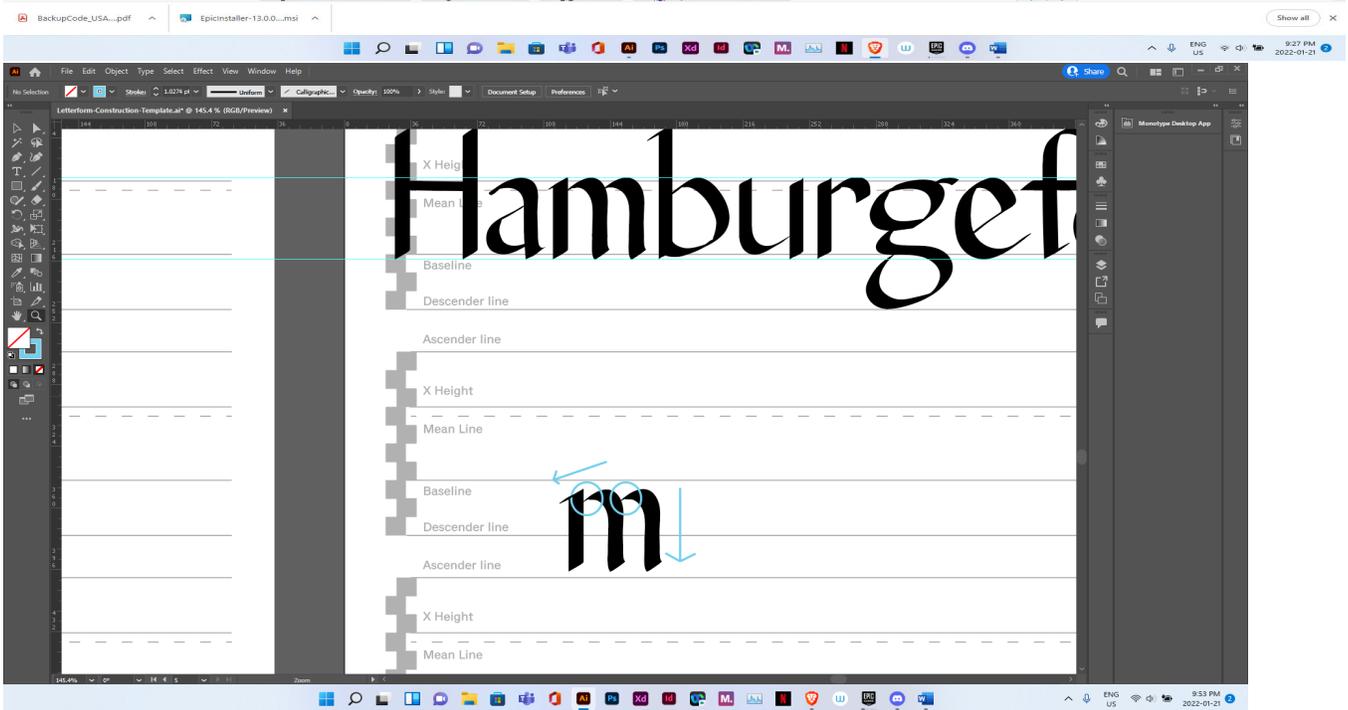
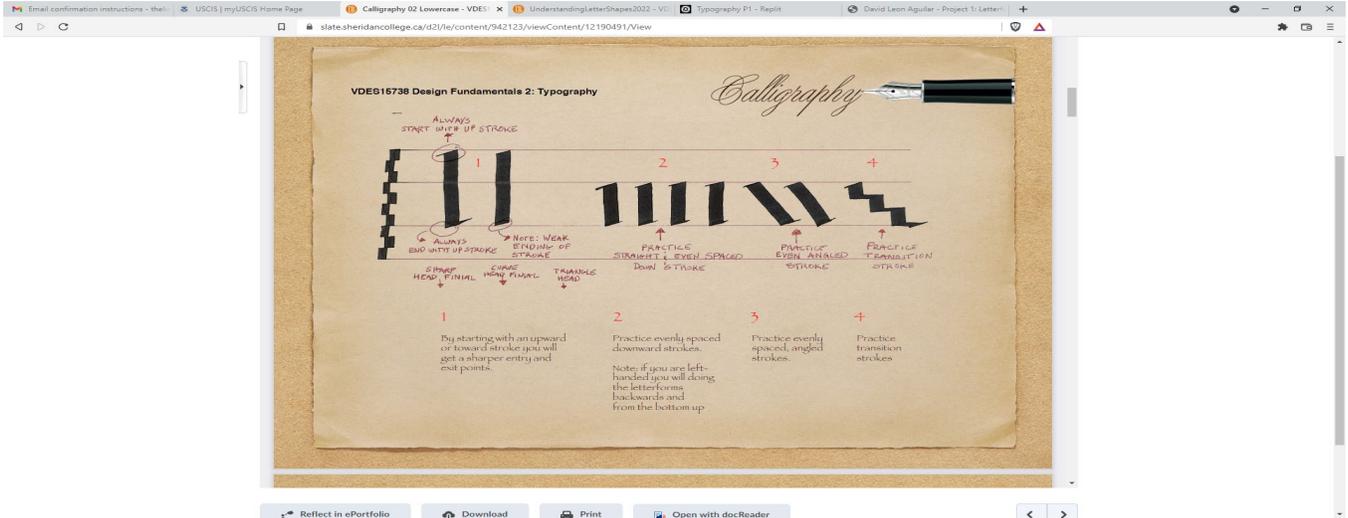


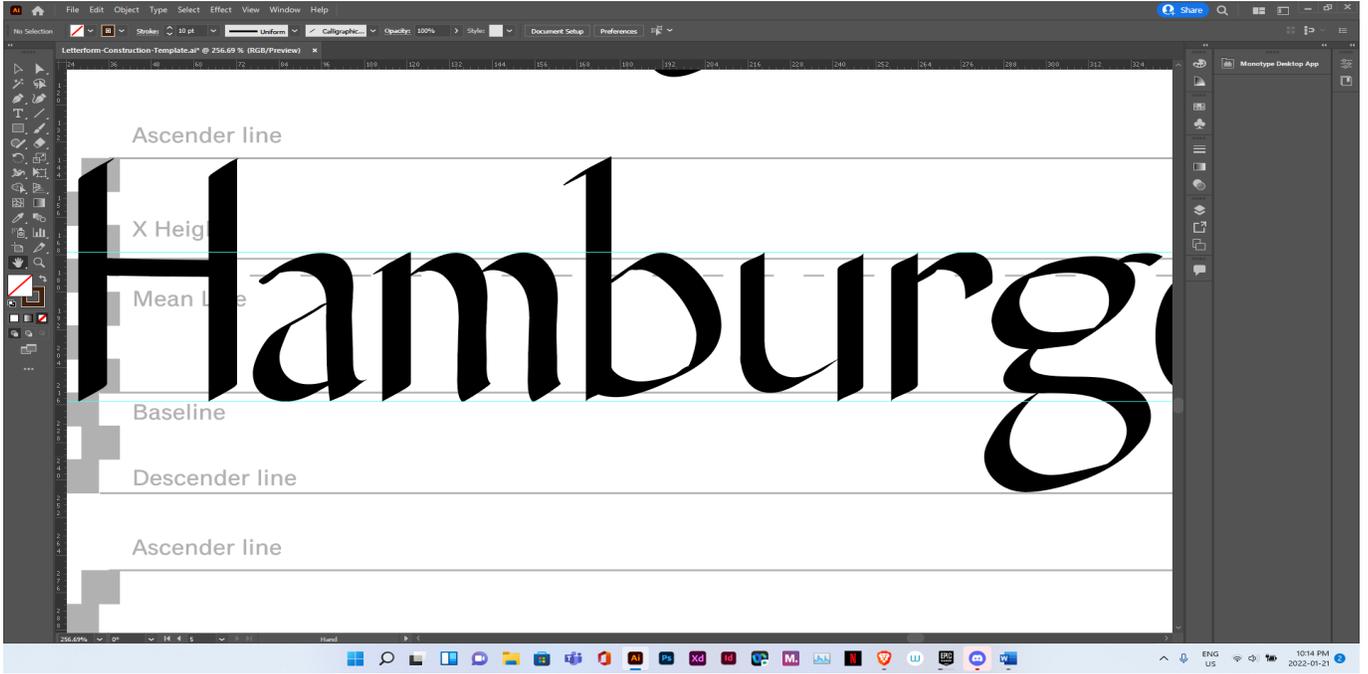
- With the “f” I stick to the plan maintaining the height of the ascender equal to the height of the example making just slight changes in the terminal.
- In the “O” I followed the example making the axis of the “O” slightly turn to the left and tried to make wider the “O” by expanding the counter space.
- For the “n” I tried to make the line after the shoulder with a little curve and at the end.

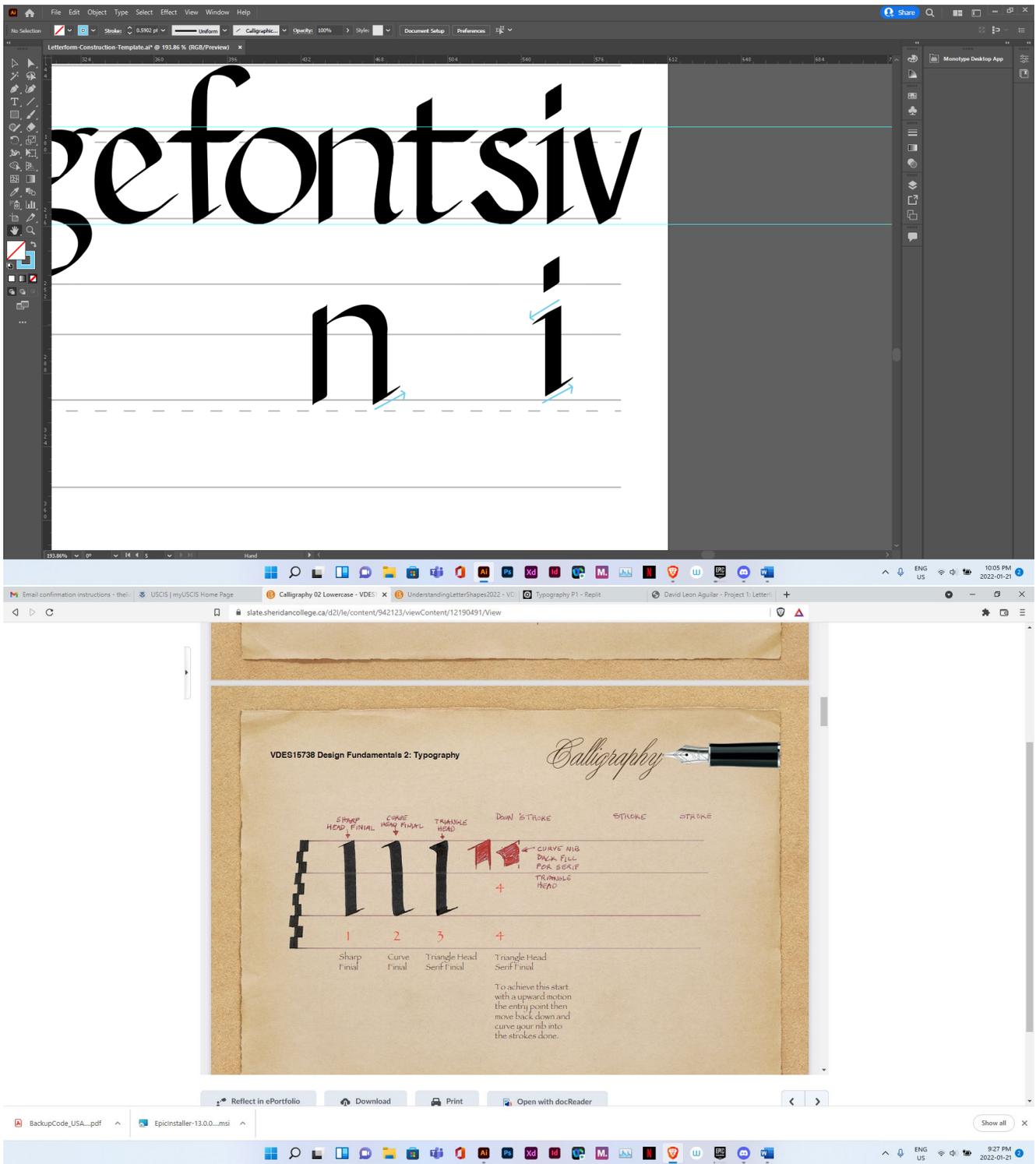
2nd Stage Refinement

In this stage, I gather the best sketches of all, and following the different calligraphy teachings made some arrangements:

- In the “M” I improve the form of the Descender line, eliminating the weak ending of the spur. Simulating a Serif-final.
- I reinvented the “I” make the beginning and final of the spur as a serif, I closed the gap between the point and the stem.
- The “N” I leave the curvy style of the stem after the shoulder, but I eliminate the weak point by making again the ending of spur as a Serif.
- I put some guidelines to set the curve forms and the stem in the same line, setting a new beginning and end to the letters.
- I corrected the spacing between the letters and re draw the “g” and “o”.



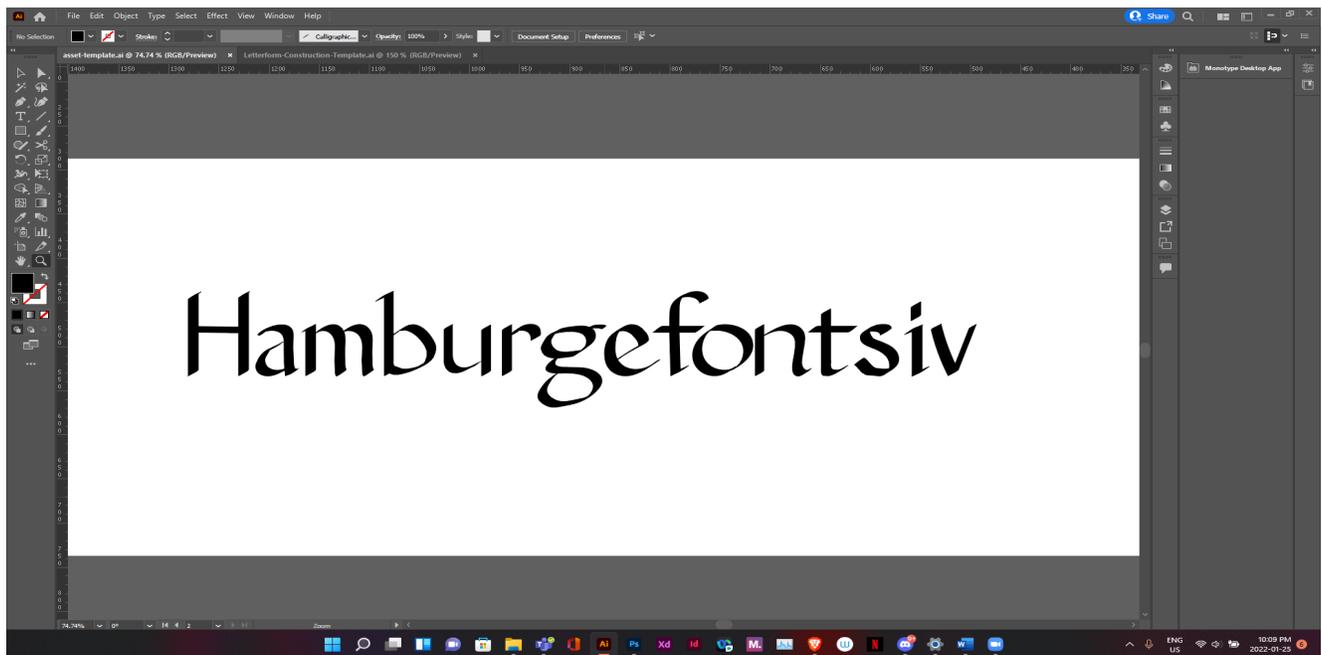
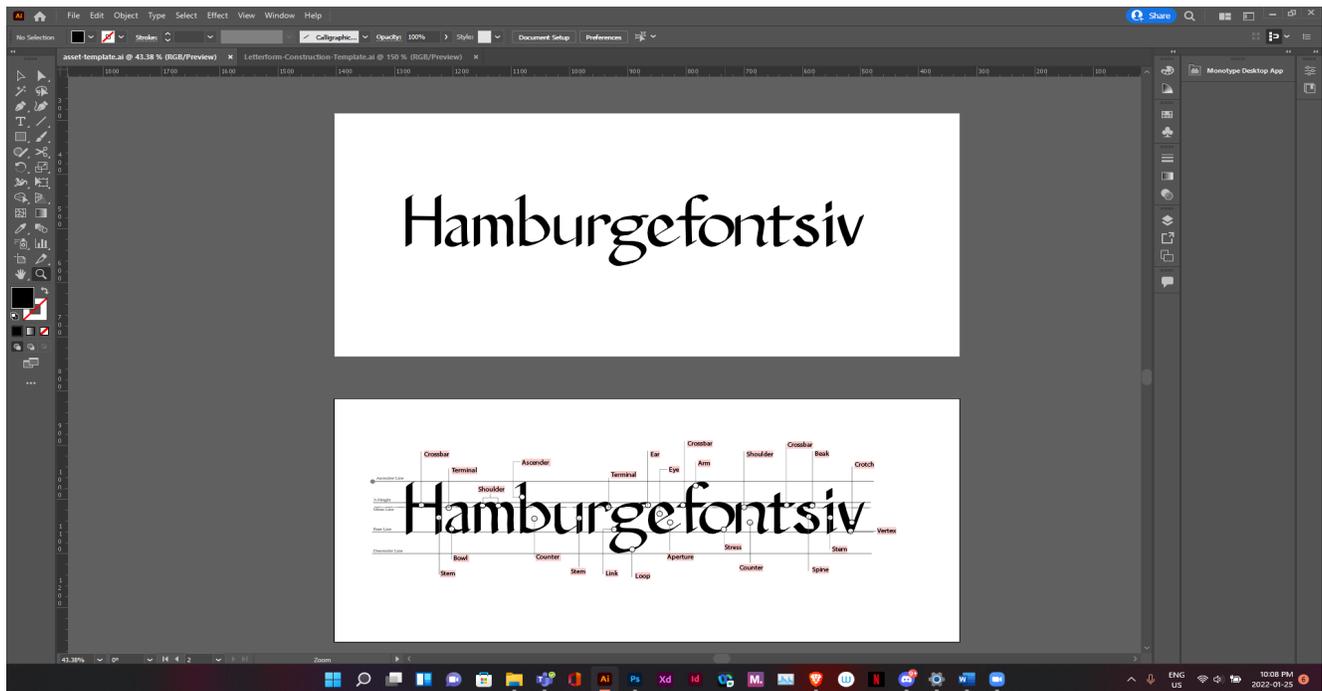


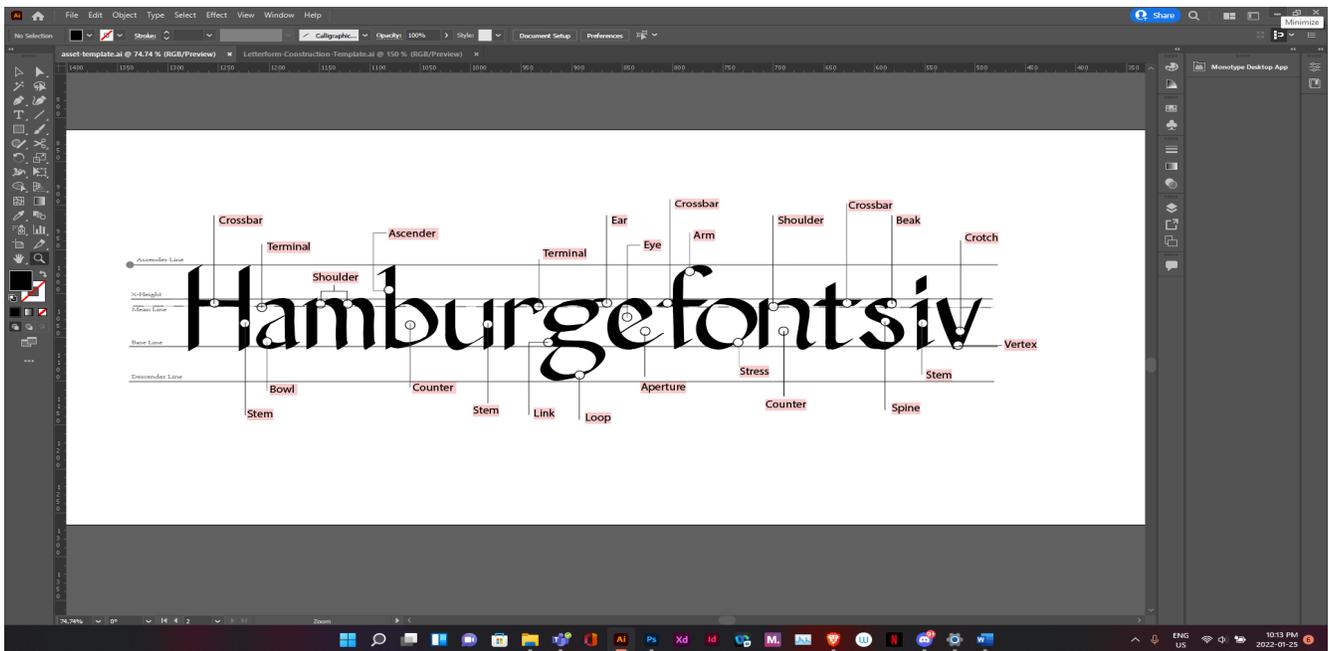
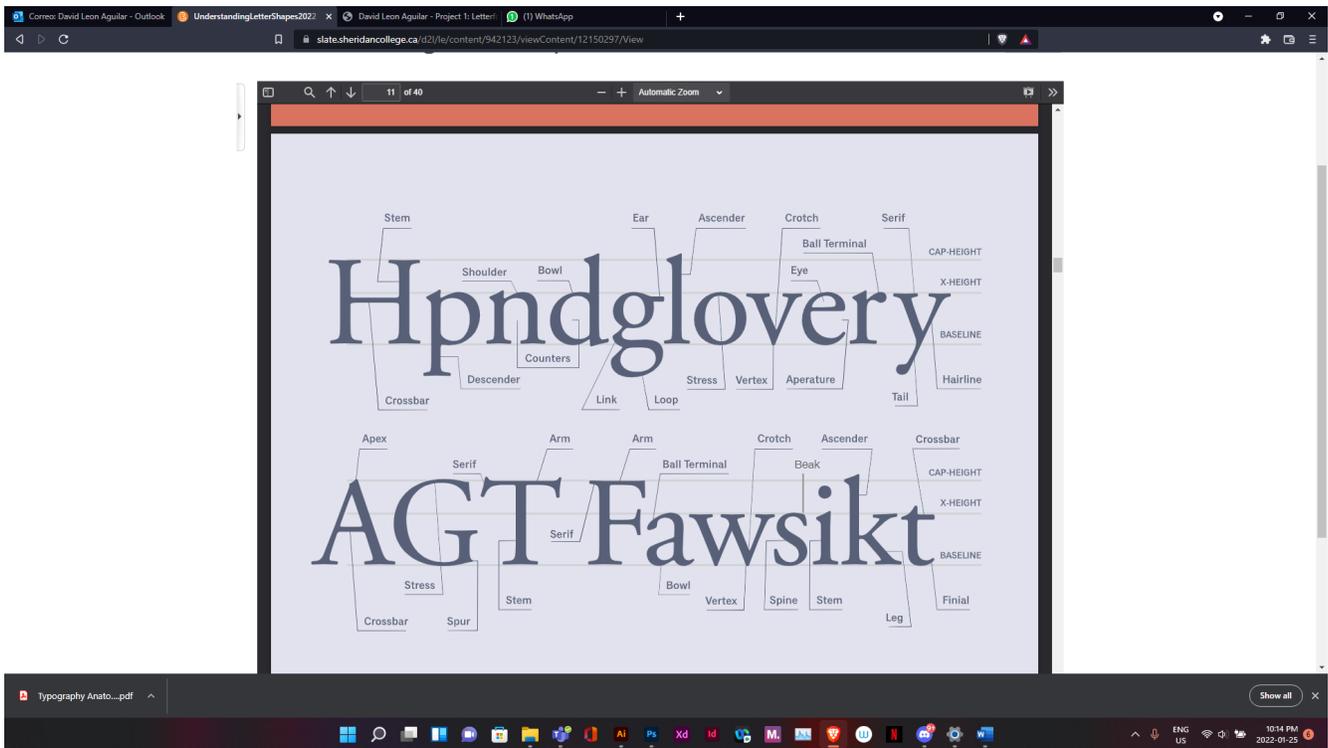


3rd Stage Final Construction & Classification

In this final stage, first I copied my “Hamburgfontsv” creation, and I exported to the “assets. ia” document. Then I began to fix and put my construction in the place of the example.

Then I did the same for the “anatomy” one and I started to label the parts of the different letters using as a reference the example given in SLATE, Here’s the result:





4th Stage Paragraph construction

In this stage I centered my efforts to improve the legibility, for my font-type, I went with 'Bitter' Sans-Serif, with around 84 characters per line, (over the 64 recommended), I think is my best text setting, I use text-align bottom to correct the overshoot of the first letter S at the beginning of my first paragraph,

and I used <https://css-tricks.com/snippets/html/glyphs/> to correct the glyphs (em & en dashes) in my text.

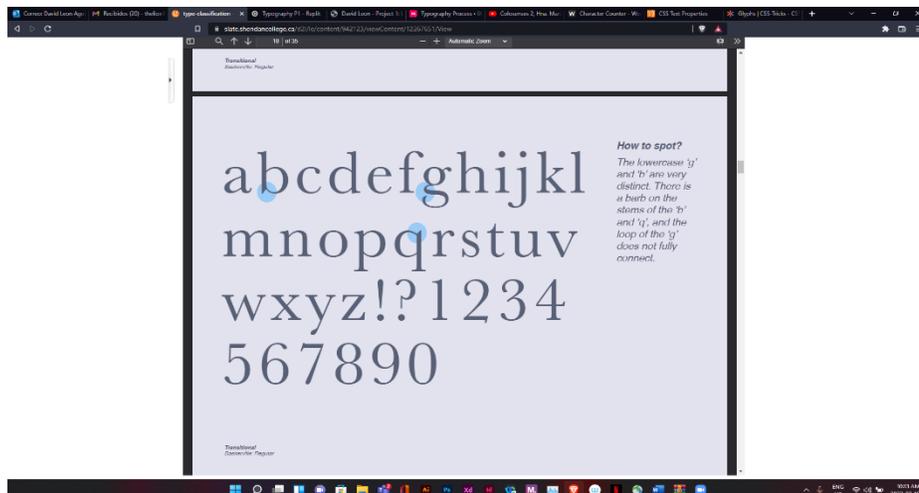

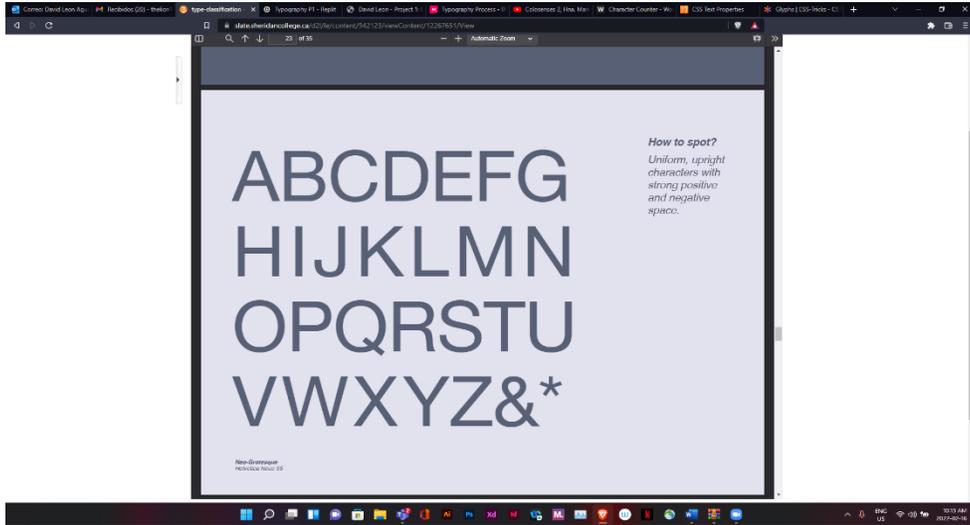
5th Stage Classification

In this stage I use the presentation as a guide to help me in the classification of my letters

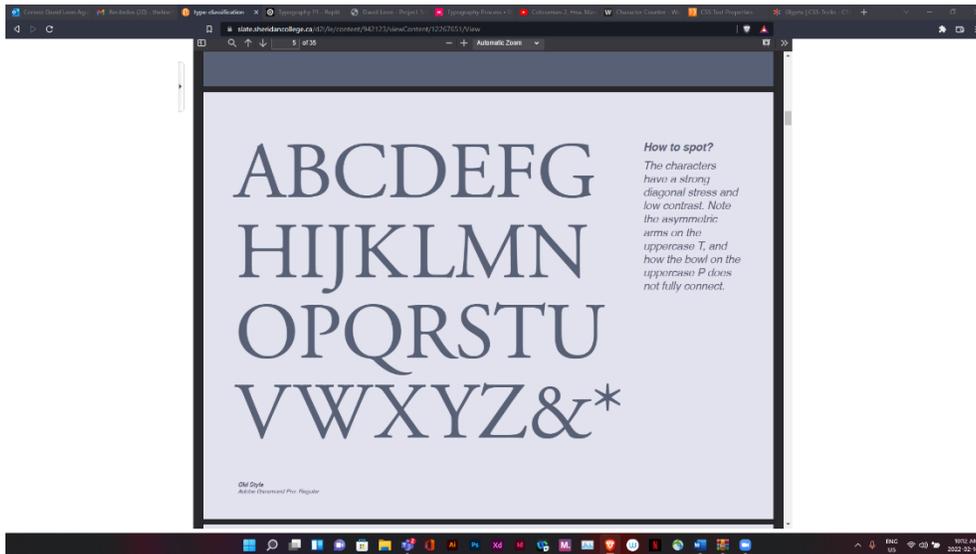

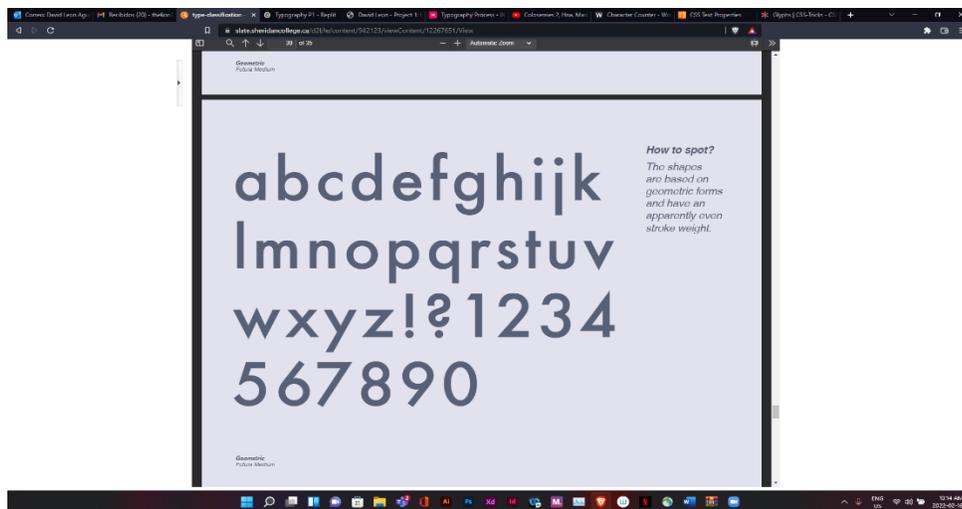
